Firewood Donations Stack Stoves in Southern Fulton County**

For several years, members of the Warfordsburg Presbyterian Church have gathered on a Saturday with chainsaws, axes, and pickups to form the Annual Firewood Brigade. This activity takes them into the woods of members or neighbors, who have reported a surplus of fallen trees. Soon the hum of the saws finds them at work cutting the fallen items into chunk size pieces suitable for wood stoves/furnaces. Then the wood is loaded on to truck vehicle beds, and taken to the unused lot at Warfordsburg Presbyterian Church where it is split, stacked and offered to the community at no cost.

Although it is a deacon project, others join in the activity to obtain wood and dispose of any rotten accumulation from the past seasons. In spite of the effort involved, good fellowship is enjoyed by the participants. In 2014, approximately 20+ cords were donated and about 5 cords remain on the stack.
