THE PRESBYTERY OF CARLISLE

WHAT IS A PRESBYTERY?

It is a way for Presbyterians to share power, responsibility, and sustain mutual relationships.

The Presbytery of Carlisle consists of 51 Presbyterian churches in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Included are both churches and their pastoral leaders in Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lebanon, and Perry Counties in Pennsylvania. Also included is one church in York County, PA, and one in Washington County, MD. The Presbytery is divided into five regions, each supported by a Regional Associate.

The voting members of the Presbytery consist of all the minister members, and at least two elder commissioners from each church, elected for that purpose by the session (the local church governing body), and other individuals as defined in the presbytery's Leadership Handbook.

"A Presbytery is a corporate expression of the church consisting of all the congregations and ministers of the Word and Sacrament within a certain district."

WHAT DOES OUR PRESBYTERY DO?

- Develops strategy for mission
- Provides encouragement and guidance to churches
- Offers pastoral care to congregations and ministers
- Guides and examines those discerning a call to ministry
- Links churches with the other governing bodies of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) - the Synod of the Trinity and the General Assembly
