- 3. Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the Confessions of our church? **I Do and I Will**
- 4. WILL you be a Minister of the Word and Sacrament in obedience to Jesus Christ under the authority of Scripture and continually guided by our confessions? I Will
- 5. WILL you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline?
 WILL you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit? I Will
- 6. WILL you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world? **I Will**
