After the approval of the Commission on Ministry, I reported to the Office of the General Assembly that Rev. Bertha van der Bent Hamel is now a member in the Presbytery of Carlisle. She is currently listed as an Honorably Retired member. I am currently in the process of asking New York City Presbytery to transfer her membership to Carlisle Presbytery.

The review of the 2018 Session records of the churches within Carlisle Presbytery took place on April 27, May 4 and May 11, 2019. The results are shown as a separate part of this report

The 2018 meeting minutes of the Presbytery of Carlisle were reviewed by the Synod of the Trinity on May 2, 2019. For the 12<sup>th</sup> year in a row, the minutes were approved with no exceptions and no delinquencies. Thanks once again to the great work done by Permanent Clerk (now Moderator) Graham Fowler and to the Ruling Elders and Ministers of Word and Sacrament in Carlisle Presbytery who reviewed them.

About 94 % of the churches in Carlisle Presbytery reported their annual statistics (as of the end of 2018) to the Office of the General Assembly. Carlisle Presbytery experienced a net decrease of 233 members. This is the lowest loss of members in my time as Stated Clerk. The Presbytery's total active membership is 10,070 as of the end of 2018.
