



- Volatile, uncertain, complex, ambiguous world
- Default emphasis on individualism
- Rise of digital age
- Families scattered; changes in patterns of marriage
- Identities shaped by brands (influence of marketers)
- Shift toward service and information economy (off-shoring, downsizing, outsourcing)
- Four-fold crisis: economic, environmental, socio-political, religious/spiritual
- Changing demographics
- Proliferation of choices, for those who have means

- Learn a new way of leading that begins with your own transformation.


