

Call to the Meeting of The Presbytery of Carlisle

Like this turtle I encountered one day last summer, we are emerging, slowly. Still following the guidance of the CDC, we are beginning to gather in our churches again. When we gather indoors, we limit our numbers. We continue to wear masks and keep distance between us. Many of us are vaccinated by now, and express a sense of relief that we can safely be with the people we love, that life itself is beginning to feel safe again.

Still, it is not the same because we are not the same. The experiences of the past year have changed us. On **Tuesday, May 25, 2021**, The Presbytery of Carlisle will gather, beginning at **6:30 p.m. on Zoom** to bear witness!

For this meeting, we're following a **Worshipful Work** model which weaves elements of worship throughout the meeting: we'll begin with liturgy, then a sermon by a candidate to be examined for ordination, we'll engage in sacred conversations and dwell in the story of Pentecost as part of our learning time, and the meeting will end with the offering of our financial gifts and prayers.

On the heels of Pentecost, our meeting will feature **break-out spaces** for presbyters to discern the Spirit's movement as we reflect on the experiences of the past year and talk about what we see God doing among us, today:

- In the past year, what nourished your spirit...what kept you grounded in God's love and engaged with activities and relationships you found life-giving?
- Look back...what has God stripped away, for our good?
- Look ahead...where do you see signs of new life emerging? What has God planted that gives you hope for the future?
- Look around....where do you see people or concerns that touch your heart and move you to want to join what God is already doing?

- Look within...what grief or lament do you carry? What do you seek to let go...to let be?
- Look beyond....what are you unlearning, for the sake of the gospel?

What is God up to? We look forward to seeing your faces and hearing your stories, as we also engage the work that represents the Spirit's movement in and through our presbytery.

We strongly recommend that each person attending this meeting with voice and vote be signed into Zoom on a device that includes both aural and visual participation. Please also verify that you are using the latest version of Zoom. This will facilitate your participation in all elements of the meeting.
