Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. popularized the term and infused it with deep meaning over the course of his life and work for peace and justice. For followers of Jesus the Christ, our Triune God reveals Beloved Community to us in eternity. The Persons of the Trinity are distinctive yet united, each with a different way of expressing the same love and nature. Among the three there is mutuality, absolute trust, and an outpouring and love and energy to and for the other. As congregations and as a presbytery we seek to embody Beloved Community through our work, worship, and being together. Our time together will begin with worship at 9:00 am, praising our Triune God, acknowledging our brokenness, and being opened to receive anew the abundant life offered in Christ.
