

Weave Week Itinerary

Each day will have a different theme: Environment, Racism, Immigration, and Poverty. There will be time for the youth to learn, hands on application, worship, and fellowship. Sleeping arrangements will be at Messiah University, with breakfast daily. Dinner will often be hands-on and interactive.

Tuesday July 7th: Arrive at Messiah University in Grantham PA between 8:30 and 9 am. The day will consist of an opening keynote, a trip to City Island with a speaker, and a trip to Whittle Farm for a hands-on experience of Farm to Table.

Wednesday July 8th: The day will be spent primarily in Harrisburg, where the youth will have a keynote address in the morning, a cemetery clean up, and a walking tour of Harrisburg's old Eighth Ward. The evening activity will be at Messiah University where we will have use of their pool. **(Appropriate swim attire required)**

Thursday July 9th: This day will be spent primarily in Gettysburg. There will be a keynote in the morning, followed by a visit to Painted Turtle Farm. The youth will then prepare and bring dinner to local migrant camps in Adams County.

Friday July 10th: This day again will be spent in Gettysburg. Liz Theo-Harris from the Poor people's campaign will be our keynote speaker, and in the afternoon youth will participate in a poverty simulator.

Saturday July 11th: Fun day at Hershey Park! Tickets will be included with the week, but youth are asked to bring money for food for the day. Pick up will be at Monaghan Presbyterian Church at 5pm.

We hope this week will give our youth a chance to experience some current topics as they learn to engage with difficult concepts with each other. They will have a chance to work with small groups and explore the ideas of the day more fully, while coming together in worship to center ourselves in God.
